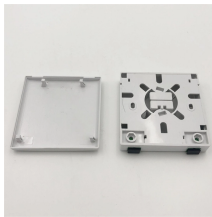
Overview

In addition to simply routing and protecting cables a cable tray system must provide protection to life and property against faults caused by electrical disturbances, lightening, failures which are part of the system, and failures of equipment that is connected to the system.

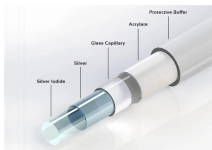
Can galvanized cable trays use a ground wire

At the vertical drops, a #3 insulated wire is split bolted onto the #3/0 and run with the tray cable in each separate conduit down to the panel. In the panel: you now have 2x #3 ground wires, ...



If a wire mesh cable tray is supporting cable with a built-in equipment grounding conductor or control or signal cables, then the tray should have a low impedance ...



This is accomplished, in accordance with NEC 392.60 (A), by insuring the cable tray system is electrically continuous and properly grounded i.e. connected to the facility ground network.



If the cable trays cross section area is insufficient for the protective device rating, the cable tray can't be used as the EGC and a separate EGC single conductor cable must be installed in the cable tray or ...

Motor protection controller



Yes, the metal cable tray can serve as the safety ground, which means that you may not need another piece of green copper wire. To make this happen, the tray should be specifically tested ...



In some cases, the cable tray can serve as the grounding conductor. This is only suitable for metal trays that meet certain conductivity and strength requirements.

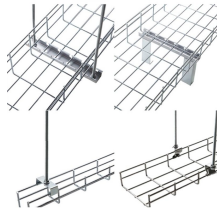
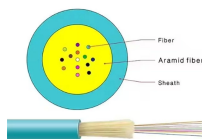

All metallic cable trays shall be grounded as required in Article 250.96 regardless of whether or not the cable tray is being used as an equipment grounding conductor (EGC).



Grounding is one of the most critical NEC considerations when installing metallic cable trays. To comply with code requirements and ensure system safety, metallic trays must be ...



Cable tray may be used as the Equipment Grounding Conductor (EGC) in any installation where qualified persons will service the installed cable tray system. There is no restriction as to ...

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
