

IT racks and cold aisles



Overview

The hot and cold aisles in the data center are part of an energy-efficient layout for server racks and other computing equipment. The goal of a hot/cold aisle configuration is to manage airflow in a way that c.



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In a typical data center, racks are arranged in alternating hot and cold aisles. Cold air is delivered to the front of the racks, where servers pull it in to stay cool, and the hot air exits from the back of the racks ...



Hot aisle/cold aisle layout can still be used in server rooms without raised floors: distinct hot and cold aisles can be created by rearranging server rack locations and then reconfiguring the ductwork above.



In this guide, we'll break down how hot aisle and cold aisle configurations work, what containment systems do, and why airflow management is critical in today's high-density data centers.



An aisle containment system is a simple way to improve cooling efficiency in hot aisle/cold aisle rack configurations. Essentially creating a room within the aisle, the system helps keep hot and cold air ...

Arranging racks into a hot aisle/cold aisle configuration (discussed at right) is a cooling best practice that has been implemented to improve the efficiency of raised floor data centers.



Cold aisle containment systems use doors at aisle ends, ceiling panels or lids above racks, and structural frames to create enclosed zones where cold supply air flows directly to IT equipment intakes.
