Overview

The EHCVM is a nationally representative survey of 6,000 households, which are also representative of the geopolitical zones (at both the urban and rural level). The Niger EHCVM 2021/22 is the second edition of a nationally representative household survey conducted within the West Africa Economic Monetary Union (WAEMU) Household Survey harmonization Project (P153702) a joint program by the World Bank and the WAEMU Commission that aims at producing household. The International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI), established in 1975, provides evidence-based policy solutions to sustainably end hunger and malnutrition and reduce poverty. The Institute conducts research, communicates results, optimizes partnerships, and builds capacity to ensure. Project 21 (P21) documents the ongoing protection crisis affecting displaced populations and host communities in Niger.
