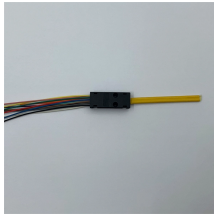

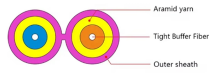
Different applications require different types of distribution boxes. Selecting the right type ensures optimal performance and compliance with relevant standards. Home distribution boxes ...
