If you're using weatherproof panels or distribution boxes, make sure they are NEMA-rated and appropriate for the worksite. 408 contain installation safety requirements for electrical equipment and installations used to provide electric power and light at the jobsite. These sections apply to installations, both temporary and permanent, used on the jobsite; but these sections do not apply. 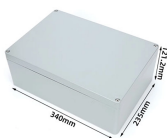
